Abstract Length	100-350 words (briefly describe the issue, methods and finding)
Expected Length of Presentation at ICES21	A maximum of 20 minutes

Abstracts should be in the fields of social sciences and humanities with a focus on Ethiopia and its region, and must be situated under one of the following panels:

- Food security
- Ethiopian manuscript studies

- Local knowledge for innovation and sustainable development: Multidisciplinary approaches to the understandings of community initiatives

- Power, Protest and Prosperity: Politics of Transition and Reversal
- Aging Societies and Lifelong Sciences
- In Search of a Local Cure for Ethiopia's Education? Let us go for 'Abännät'
- Ethnographica Amhara: Future Ethnography of Amhara Region
- After Abolition: Slavery, Labour, and Social Stratification in Ethiopia since 1942

The committee will review submitted abstracts and notify applicants of acceptance or rejection within ten days. The committee reserves the right to suggest minor changes to the paper in accordance with the panel organizers' expectations, in order to ensure that it fits in with the conference themes. All papers should be based on original research or present new viewpoints in academic discussions.

It is also acceptable for one researcher to make multiple presentations at ICES21.
